From the Pastor's Pen...



Dear Brothers and Sisters at Grace,

In Romans we read, "The gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord" (Romans 6:23). Speaking of being saved from God's eternal anger the Bible says, "By grace are you saved...it is the gift of God" (Ephesians 2:8,9). When one seeks to earn a gift - it ceases to be a gift and becomes a wage. When one seeks to deserve a gift - it ceases to be a gift and becomes a reward. What God offers to you through the death and resurrection for your sins is a gift. To seek to earn it or deserve it is an insult to God.

That God's favor is a gift is revealed to us in Holy Scripture. Martin Luther discovered that around 1517 and built his whole theology upon it. Those who followed Luther built a new Protestant Church around it of which we are a part today. Every religion (other than salvation through faith in Jesus Christ) teaches that one must work for or deserve God's favor. This is our nature: We think we must work for what we get. Even when churches neglect the Bible, the attention will be centered on what people must do. The Reformation beginning in the year 1517 turned the attention back to the finished work of Jesus Christ as revealed in Holy Scripture.

The Reformation of the Church is a wonderful, living example of how we must seek to bring reform into our own lives. Am I spending time in God's Word each day? Am I giving sacrificially to God's ministry at Grace? Do I look forward to worship every week? When in worship, do I devote my whole mind and attitude towards His glory and worship or am I busy with other things? Am I warm and welcoming towards all people? In my daily life, do I invite people to know Jesus Christ and invite them to Grace? Ponder these questions, my friends, and allow God's Holy Spirit to reform your hearts and minds. See you in worship!

HIGHLIGHTS OF OCTOBER BOARD MEETING (held October 16, 2016)


- ➤ 2017 Spending Plan was reviewed and Board accepted and approved the proposed Spending Plan for 2017 to be presented to the congregation for approval at the Annual Congregation Meeting on November 6.
- Names of possible nominees for Board were received and approved. Names received to be on the ballot are: Alan Shull, Joe Momier, Frankie Crouse. Additional names are being vetted at this time. The Board approved that Tim Eckard remain on the Board for one year in order that the election of 3 seats would be filled each year beginning in 2018.
- ► Fall Festival will be held Saturday, October 29 at 4 p.m.
- ▶ All AC and Heating units have been serviced and filters changed. Fellowship Hall closet has been cleaned and painted with sealant.
- ▶ Ownership of property tracts owned by Grace Church were discussed and are under review with a report to be taken up by the Board in 2017.

NOTES FROM BEN WITHERINGTON

"Elsewhere in this letter Paul says 'all things are lawful for me; but I shall not let myself fall into the power of any of them.' Here is the first clue. God has given us—most of us—a rich wealth of possibilities.

There is human love to enjoy, loving and being loved. There is the realm of things, things that can be bought and sold in the process of which we increase our wealth and multiply our resources. There is the world—so full (if I may quote another source) 'of a number of things, I'm sure we should all be as happy as kings': the exercise of the body, the exercise of the mind. God put human beings into the world and said 'subdue and rule it, make it yours, enjoy your gifts.'

But the trouble comes when a human being becomes so devoted to the exercise of his gifts that he becomes their slave. He no longer rules his environment, his environment rules him. This is the real fault of a permissive society. How many a young man and a young woman thought that sex would be fun, and went on and on until they found themselves the slaves of it. Or how many a person thought a bit of drugs would be fun, and found himself the slave of a habit he could not control? How many a person, how many a church member, set out to get himself a comfortable life by buying and selling so as to make money, and in the end found himself the slave of the money he had made? The horror of permissiveness is that it ends in bondage."

THOUGHTS FROM C.K. BARRETT

I never know quite what to say when I'm talking sometimes to people who have lost a loved one and they say 'well it was God's will', when sometimes I know that to be an errant blasphemy on the love not to say the common sense of God. Much of the suffering of life is due to human sin and to say that it is God's will is just a lie.

Of course it is not (to take just the most obvious example) God's will that so many of the best young men should be dying in the wars of today. But— and this is the positive thing I have to say—Christianity is at home in those places. That is where it belongs.

Granted that human folly and sin have made this world a hell, it is into this hell that God comes. This is the meaning of Christmas—where sin abounded, grace abounded all the more.
