THEME FOR MAUNDY THURSDAY: If I simply say the words, "Mission Impossible," does the theme song to that series start playing in your head? Tonight is about what would seem to be Mission Impossible, the salvation of the world. But tonight we celebrate that it is Mission Impossible as Jesus reminds us that He gave His Body and Blood for us and for our sins. That is how much you are loved.

<u>STRIPPING OF THE ALTAR</u> - The Meal is over, and Gethsemane draws nigh. Our Lord will be betrayed, condemned, and handed over to death. In anticipation of Easter, the altar, like our Lord, is stripped, awaiting death and burial.

MAUNDY THURSDAY, the night on which our Savior was betrayed, was the occasion of the Passover meal and His Last Supper with the disciples. Communion will be distributed by worshipers coming forward down the center aisle at the direction of the Ushers. Each worshiper will receive the bread from the Pastor and then a cup of wine from one of the Communion Assistants. If you cannot come forward, please stand and the Pastor will bring the elements to you.

Following the Eucharist, Psalm 22 will be read while the altar is stripped, laid bare for remembering the crucifixion of our Lord.

We have looked at the veiled cross throughout the season of Lent, remembering that Jesus hung on the cross to die for our sins, and rose from the dead to give us eternal life with Him.

You are invited to bring <u>live</u> flowers to the church on Saturday and place them on the outside cross. These can be store bought flowers or ones from your garden. **No** artificial flowers, please! We have looked at the bare cross through Lent, remembering that Jesus hung on the cross to die for our sins and rose from the dead to give us eternal life with Him. So we bring "new life" to the cross by covering it with flowers.

For the Easter Sunrise Worship in Union Church, any Senior Citizens, or those requiring assistance, feel free to park at Union Church. Ushers will be available for assistance.
