

WELCOME TO ALL WHO WORSHIP at Grace Church this morning as we gather to worship the Father, + Son and Holy Spirit in truth. As you entered the sanctuary today, you received this bulletin containing the order for worship and announcements. Please also notice the Prayer List where you will find a listing of all the known prayer concerns. You are invited to use this as a guide for your personal prayers throughout the coming week. THIS WEEK'S THEME: In today's Gospel lesson, we are going to read part of what is called the High Priestly Prayer, a prayer that is prayed by Jesus to God the Father. Part of this prayer will be that we might be one, even as God the Father and God the Son are one, that we might be one. The sad reality is that often the church is anything but one.

FIRST LESSON: Acts 1:12-26

¹²Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a Sabbath day's journey away. ¹³And when they had entered, they went up to the upper room, where they were staying, Peter and John and James and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James the son of Alphaeus and Simon the Zealot and Judas the son of James. 14All these with one accord were devoting themselves to prayer, together with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and his brothers. ¹⁵In those days Peter stood up among the brothers (the company of persons was in all about 120) and said, 16"Brothers, the Scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit spoke beforehand by the mouth of David concerning Judas, who became a guide to those who arrested Jesus. ¹⁷For he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry." ¹⁸(Now this man acquired a field with the reward of his wickedness, and falling headlong he burst open in the middle and all his bowels gushed out. ¹⁹And it became known to all the inhabitants of Jerusalem, so that the field was called in their own language Akeldama, that is, Field of Blood.) ²⁰"For it is written in the Book of Psalms, "'May his camp become desolate, and let there be no one to dwell in it'; and "'Let another take his office.' 21 So one of the men who have accompanied us during all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, ²² beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us—one of these men must become with us a witness to his resurrection." ²³ And they put forward two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also called Justus, and Matthias. ²⁴And they prayed and said, "You, Lord, who know the hearts of all, show which one of these two you have chosen ²⁵ to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place." ²⁶ And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias, and he was numbered with the eleven apostles.

PSALM 1

¹Happy are they who have not walked in the counsel of the wicked, nor lingered in the way of sinners, nor sat in the seats of the scornful!

²Their delight is in the law of the LORD, and they meditate on his law day and night.

³They are like trees planted by streams of water, bearing fruit in due season, with leaves that do not wither; everything they do shall prosper.

⁴It is not so with the wicked;

They are like chaff which the wind blows away.

⁵Therefore the wicked shall not stand upright when judgment comes, nor the sinner in the council of the righteous.

⁶For the LORD knows the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked is doomed.

SECOND LESSON: 1 John 5:9-15

⁹If we receive the testimony of men, the testimony of God is greater, for this is the testimony of God that has borne concerning his Son. ¹⁰Whoever believes in the Son of God has the testimony in himself. Whoever does not believe God has made him a liar, because he has not believed in the testimony that God has borne concerning his Son. ¹¹And this is the testimony that God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. ¹²Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life. ¹³I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, that you may know that you have eternal life. ¹⁴And this is the confidence that we have toward him, that if we ask anything according to his will he hears us. ¹⁵And if we know that he hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests that we have asked of him.

THE HOLY GOSPEL: John 17:11b-19

^{11b} Holy Father, keep them in your name, which you have given me, that they may be one, even as we are one. ¹² While I was with them, I kept them in your name, which you have given me. I have guarded them, and not one of them has been lost except the son of destruction, that the Scripture might be fulfilled. ¹³ But now I am coming to you, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have my joy fulfilled in themselves. ¹⁴ I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. ¹⁵ I do not ask that you take them out of the world, but that you keep them from the evil one. ¹⁶ They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. ¹⁷ Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. ¹⁸As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. ¹⁹ And for their sake I consecrate myself, that they also may be sanctified in truth.

The Ascension of Our Lord | May 9, 2024



LUKE 24:44-53

"...repentance for the forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in his name" Vs. 47

Jesus bestows a gift upon his disciples. He opens their minds to understand the Scriptures (vs. 45). Those disciples have been with him three years... three years and they still hadn't understood. They didn't comprehend Jesus' place in their own Scriptures and his fulfillment of what was written. But now, Jesus is changing their title and job description. No longer will they be known as disciples, following after Jesus. They can't follow him as he's carried up into heaven; it's not yet their time. Their new title is that of "apostle." They are the "sent out ones." Specifically, they are sent out to proclaim, "repentance for the forgiveness of sins in Jesus' name to all nations" (vs. 47).

This is but one of five "sending" accounts: all four Gospels and the Book of Acts have one. We have become so accustomed to emphasizing the so-called "Great Commission" from Matthew's gospel that the other four sending accounts have withered in importance. We forget that "Great Commission" is merely a title assigned to it by an editor of some English language translation.

These five sending accounts (Mt. 28:16-20; Mk. 16:14-18; Lk. 24:44-49; Acts 1:6-11; & Jn. 20:19-23) have several threads in common. For instance, the disciples are not complemented

by Jesus or the gospel evangelists. Rather, the disciples are described as "fearful," "ignorant," "uncomprehending," and "disbelieving." Yet, the same authority is given to all without distinction. They are sent out to bear witness to Jesus Christ, to proclaim repentance for the forgiveness of sins in his name, and to baptize in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Jesus "blessed them" in their sending and proclamation (vs. 50).

Oh, what fruitfulness that blessing has obtained! The proclamation of those original apostles has been multiplied generation-aftergeneration until it has reached you. Upon its reaching you, you are enlisted into the ranks of apostles. Worship services conclude with your being "sent out;" you are "apostle-ized!" No matter if you be "fearful," "ignorant," "uncomprehending," or even "disbelieving." So were the originals! Go! Bear witness to Jesus Christ!

Table Talk: Have you ever thought of being an "apostle" of Jesus Christ rather than a disciple of Christ? Why or why not?

Pray: Heavenly Father, grant that I would hear my sending out and so become an apostle of Christ. Amen
