

**HAPPY FATHER'S DAY!** Father's Day is celebrated on Sunday, June 16<sup>th</sup>. Thanks to our Earthly Fathers and to our Heavenly Father! Did you know that Father's Day was first celebrated in the State of Washington on June 19, 1910? But it was not until 1972 – 58 years after President Woodrow Wilson declared Mother's Day as official – that a day honoring fathers became a nationwide holiday in the United States.

**FLAG DAY** is observed on June 14<sup>th</sup> in the United States and commemorates the date when the United States approved the design for its first national flag. In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed June 14 as the official date for Flag Day, and in 1949, US Congress permanently established the date as National Flag Day.

#### FIRST DAY OF SUMMER (SUMMER SOLSTICE)

The first day of Summer (the Summer Solstice) takes place on Thursday, June 20, 2024. This marks the official beginning of Summer in the Northern Hemisphere. It is the longest day of the calendar year (longest period of sunlight hours) and the shortest night of the calendar year.

#### Summer Solstice Quiz

See how much you know about the summer solstice with these 10 questions!

- 1. How often do solstices happen?
- 2. Where does the word solstice come from (hint: Latin words)?
- 3. Does the solstice occur at the same time or at different times across the world?
- 4. Is the June solstice always on June 21?
- 5. Is the June solstice the first day of summer in the Northern Hemisphere?
- 6. On the solstice, is the Earth the closest or farthest from the Sun?
- 7. Does the earliest sunrise happen on the summer solstice?
- 8. Is it the longest day of the year everywhere on Earth?
- 9. On the summer solstice, the Sun reaches its most northernmost position in the sky. What is this called? (Hint: Tropic of ?).
- 10. Why isn't the summer solstice the hottest day of the year?

#### Quiz Answers

- 1. Twice a year (June and December)
- 2. Latin words *sol*, meaning Sun and *sistere*, meaning to come to a stop or stand still
- 3. The exact same instant of time.
- 4. Usually, but can range from June 20 to June 22.
- 5. To astronomers, yes. But to meteorologists, it's June 1.
- 6. Farthest! Surprised? It's not the distance but Earth's tilt that matters.
- 7. Nope. Neither the earliest sunrise nor the latest sunsets are on this day.
- 8. It's the winter solstice in the Southern Hemisphere (the shortest day of the year).
- 9. On the summer solstice, the Sun is directly overhead the Tropic of Cancer.
- 10. It takes a few more weeks for the oceans and air to warm up!
