

Thanks Be to God!

Message from Pastor Doug Hefner

Psalm 107: 10 give thanks to the LORD, for he is good; for his steadfast love endures forever.

The last thing we say in worship before going into the mission field to share the Gospel is "Thanks be to God!" What an appropriate response for us as we receive in worship the many gifts of God's grace and love in Christ Jesus! November is a month full of great reasons to say, "Thanks be to God!" But it's not just November; every day is a day to "thank the Lord for His steadfast love and wonderful works." Of course God's Word reminds us that we can be thankful "in all circumstances", "at all times", and "for everything" as St. Paul reminds us in 1 Thessalonians 5:18 to "give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you" and Ephesians 5:20 to give "thanks to God the Father at all times and for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ."

On <u>All Saints Sunday on November 3</u>, we will celebrate God's gift of love in Christ that sets us apart and welcomes us as God's family. In Christ we are made <u>saints of God</u> (saint means "holy one" or "set apart one"). We are welcomed into the communion of saints, the Church, which includes those in heaven and on earth. We will remember with thanksgiving the precious saints in our lives who now rest from their labors and have entered the Church Triumphant. We will light a candle and ring a bell to remember *these saints who have blessed us and fill heaven now with thanksgiving*. I am thankful for each of you and for the ways we have been blessed at Grace Lutheran Church to be the saints of God. I thank God for the blessing of serving as your pastor as we begin our journey of grace together.

On <u>Sunday</u>, <u>November 10</u>, we will remember and give thanks for our veterans who have served and sacrificed so much on our behalf. Veterans' Day is Nov 11. We will have a special <u>Thanksgiving Service on Nov. 17</u> as we sing the great Thanksgiving Hymns. On <u>Sun., November 24, Christ the King Sunday</u>, we gather to give God thanks and praise as we celebrate Christ as King and Sovereign over all. And then there is <u>Thanksgiving Day on Nov 28!</u> It is a time that our nation has set aside to thank God for all our many blessings. Thanksgiving is about Giving Thanks to God who is the giver of all good gifts. So let us give thanks for the saints, for those who serve and sacrifice, for the reign of God's love in Christ, and our many blessings.

As I reflect on the good things that God has brought to us, I am thankful for you, the body of Christ here at Grace! In Ephesians 1 Paul wrote a beautiful prayer of thanksgiving and blessing for the Church. This too is my prayer for you as we begin our journey together: *Ephesians* 1:¹⁵ "I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason ¹⁶ I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers.." Saints of God at Grace, let us sing praise and give thanks for all of God's wondrous love, works and gifts in Christ! As we share in the beautiful worship services of this month, I pray that you will know God's love and lift a grateful song of praise and thanksgiving for God's many blessings.

Originally from this area (Zion Lutheran); Strongly focused in music; Focusing on Evangelism; Finding ways to connect to the community; Doing one person monologs of those in the bible; Discussed his previous experience and ministries and personal issues; Discussed family; Pastor and congregation to work together to come to solutions, not authoritarian; Pre-School ministry possibilities, other community support group possibilities; Reaching out to prior or non-attending members; Financial compensation; Finding something for youths;

- The Leadership Ministry Board voted to approve a recommendation to the congregation for Pastor Doug Hefner to be extended a call as our next pastor.

- C. Kristi Tucker shared that she has accepted a new job at Lenoir-Rhyne University. It is a tremendous opportunity for her and her family. She has expressed a willingness to continue working at Grace in a remote capacity for the time being.
- D. There was a discussion regarding obtaining a new Christmas tree as the current one is in bad shape. A motion was made and seconded to purchase a new tree. MOTION CARRIED.
- E. The hanging of the greens will be done on Saturday, November 30th.
- F. Rick Bivens reviewed the proposed spending plan for 2025.
- G. A motion was made and seconded to accept the proposed spending plan. MOTION CARRIED. Time will be given on October 27 after worship for discussion / questions if anyone is interested. The plan will be put before the Congregation for a vote on Sunday, November 3.
