Advent Wreath Lighting Litany

L: Today is the first Sunday of Advent. Advent means "coming" and in this season we prepare for and celebrate the coming of Christ among us. We rejoice in His first advent, His coming among us now, and prepare for His return. Lighting the candles of the Advent Wreath remind us of the gifts Christ brings to the world. The shape of the Advent Wreath, circle, and its evergreen branches, remind us that there is no beginning and no end to God and that God's love and faithfulness are eternal. The light from the candles - which grows stronger each Sunday in Advent, reminds us that Jesus is the light of the world. He is the light that overcomes the darkness. The candles remind us of God's gifts in Christ: Hope, Peace, Joy, Love, and Presence. Today we light the candle of hope.

L: The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light;

C: those who lived in a land of deep darkness on them light has shined.

L: We join with sisters and brothers around the world, lighting candles to mark our steps in this Advent journey.

C: Today, we light the candle of Hope and give thanks for God's gift of hope.

We light the Candle of Hope as we sing "A Candle is Burning" by Sandra Dean (Tune: Away in a Manger)

A Candle is burning, a flame warm and bright, a candle of hope in December's dark night. While angels sing blessing from heaven's starry sky, our hearts we prepare now for Jesus is nigh.

L: Even though the world seems dark and cold, we know that the light of Christ is shining in the darkness and the darkness cannot overcome it. The face of our Lord shines upon us and we are saved!

C: Hope is like a light shining in a dark place. We celebrate the hope we have in Jesus Christ and our calling to share this hope with the world by letting our light shine before others.

L: Let us "always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have." (1 Peter 3:14)

C: We continue to hope in God's promise that Christ will come again to fill our lives and the lift of the world with love and joy and peace.

L: Let us pray: Prayer of the Day

C: Amen.

WELCOME TO ALL WHO WORSHIP at Grace Church this morning as we gather to worship the Father, + Son and Holy Spirit in truth. As you entered the sanctuary today, you received this bulletin containing the order for worship and announcements. THIS WEEK'S THEME: On Christmas Eve in 1223 AD, St. Francis of Assisi prepared the first nativity scene to be used for worship (see newsletter for full story). As worshippers gathered outside a cave in Italy, they saw the Christ child in a manger with hay along with Mary and Joseph, the animals, shepherds, and angels. Since then, the nativity scene has become a part of the way we celebrate Christmas. In this season of Advent and Christmas we are going to hear about each member of the Nativity Scene and see how their story proclaims the Good News of God's love in Christ. Today we will welcome Zechariah and Elizabeth, the parents of John the Baptist (Luke 1:5-25, 57-80). Now wait a minute, they are not in the Nativity Scene normally; but they should be! God uses this older couple to remind us that He works through surprising and unlikely people and circumstances to bring us hope. Next Sunday, December 8, we will add John the Baptist, the messenger of God who calls us to prepare the way of the Lord (Luke 3:1-20).

FIRST LESSON: Jeremiah 33:14-16

¹⁴"Behold, the days are coming, declares the LORD, when I will fulfill the promise I made to the house of Israel and the house of Judah. ¹⁵In those days and at that time I will cause a righteous Branch to spring up for David, and he shall execute justice and righteousness in the land. ¹⁶In those days Judah will be saved, and Jerusalem will dwell securely. And this is the name by which it will be called: 'The LORD is our righteousness."

PSALM 25:1-10

¹To you, O LORD, I lift up my soul; my God, I put my trust in you; let me not be humiliated, nor let my enemies triumph over me.

²Let none who look to you be put to shame;

let the treacherous be disappointed in their schemes.

³Show me your ways, O LORD, and teach me your paths.

⁴Lead me in your truth and teach me,

for you are the God of my salvation; in you have I trusted all the day long.

⁵Remember, O LORD, your compassion and love, for they are from everlasting.

⁶Remember not the sins of my youth and my transgressions; remember me according to your love and for the sake of your goodness, O LORD.

⁷Gracious and upright is the LORD;

therefore he teaches sinners in his way.

⁸He guides the humble in doing right and teaches his way to the lowly.

⁹All the paths of the LORD are love and faithfulness to those who keep his covenant and his testimonies.

¹⁰For your name's sake, O LORD, forgive my sin, for it is great.

SECOND LESSON: 1 Thessalonians 3:9-13

⁹What thanksgiving can we return to God for you, for all the joy that we feel for your sake before our God, ¹⁰as we pray most earnestly night and day that we may see you face to face and supply what is lacking in your faith? ¹¹Now may our God and Father himself, and our Lord Jesus, direct our way to you, ¹²and may the Lord make you increase and abound in love for one another and for all, as we do for you, ¹³so that he may establish your hearts blameless in holiness before our God and Father, at the coming of our Lord Jesus with all his saints.

THE HOLY GOSPEL: Luke 1:5-25

⁵ In the days of Herod, king of Judea, there was a priest named Zechariah, of the division of Abijah. And he had a wife from the daughters of Aaron, and her name was Elizabeth. ⁶ And they were both righteous before God, walking blamelessly in all the commandments and statutes of the Lord. ⁷ But they had no child, because Elizabeth was barren, and both were advanced in years. 8 Now while he was serving as priest before God when his division was on duty, 9 according to the custom of the priesthood, he was chosen by lot to enter the temple of the Lord and burn incense. 10 And the whole multitude of the people were praying outside at the hour of incense. 11 And there appeared to him an angel of the Lord standing on the right side of the altar of incense. ¹² And Zechariah was troubled when he saw him, and fear fell upon him. ¹³ But the angel said to him, "Do not be afraid, Zechariah, for your prayer has been heard, and your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you shall call his name John. 14 And you will have joy and gladness, and many will rejoice at his birth, ¹⁵ for he will be great before the Lord. And he must not drink wine or strong drink, and he will be filled with the Holy Spirit, even from his mother's womb, 16 And he will turn many of the children of Israel to the Lord their God, ¹⁷ and he will go before him in the spirit and power of Elijah, to

turn the hearts of the fathers to the children, and the disobedient to the wisdom of the just, to make ready for the Lord a people prepared." ¹⁸ And Zechariah said to the angel, "How shall I know this? For I am an old man, and my wife is advanced in years." ¹⁹ And the angel answered him, "I am Gabriel. I stand in the presence of God, and I was sent to speak to you and to bring you this good news. ²⁰ And behold, you will be silent and unable to speak until the day that these things take place, because you did not believe my words, which will be fulfilled in their time." ²¹ And the people were waiting for Zechariah, and they were wondering at his delay in the temple. ²² And when he came out, he was unable to speak to them, and they realized that he had seen a vision in the temple. And he kept making signs to them and remained mute. ²³ And when his time of service was ended, he went to his home. ²⁴ After these days his wife Elizabeth conceived, and for five months she kept herself hidden, saying, ²⁵ "Thus the Lord has done for me in the days when he looked on me, to take away my reproach among people."


