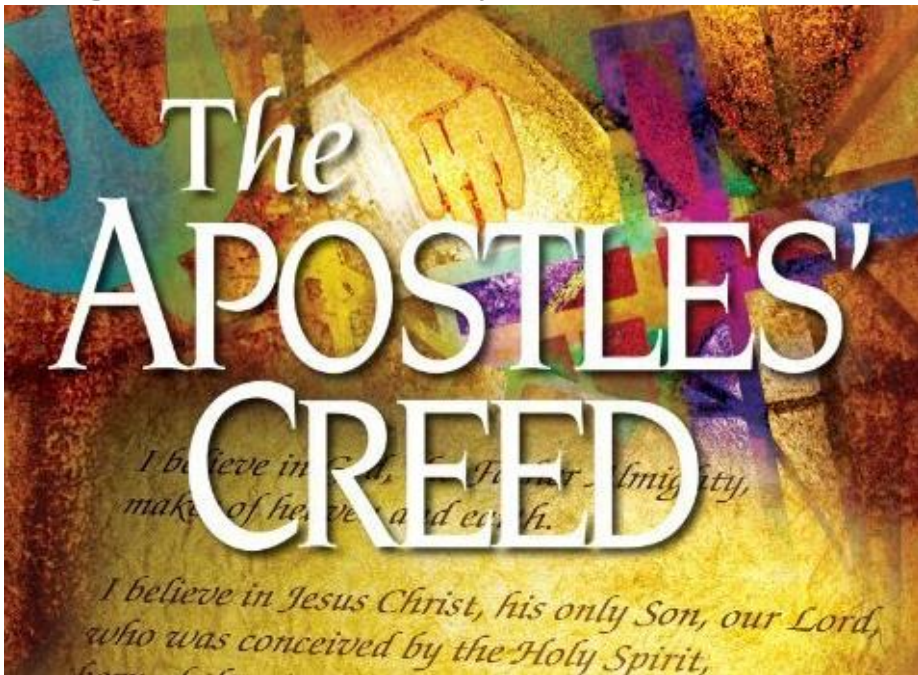

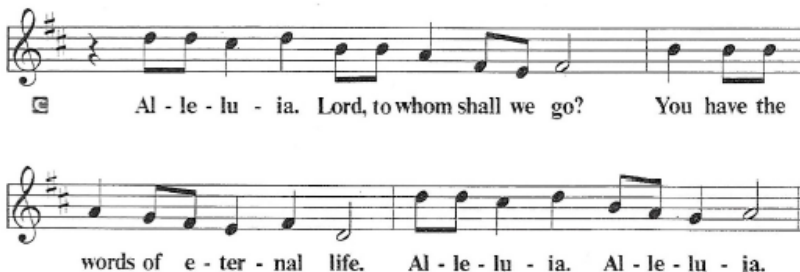
**SECOND READING: Colossians: 1: 9-20**

<sup>9</sup>For this reason, since the day we heard it, we have not ceased praying for you and asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of God's will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, <sup>10</sup>so that you may lead lives worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him, as you bear fruit in every good work and as you grow in the knowledge of God. <sup>11</sup>May you be made strong with all the strength that comes from his glorious power, and may you be prepared to endure everything with patience, while joyfully <sup>12</sup>giving thanks to the Father, who has enabled you to share in the inheritance of the saints in the light. <sup>13</sup>He has rescued us from the power of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of his beloved Son, <sup>14</sup>in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins. <sup>15</sup>He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation; <sup>16</sup>for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers — all things have been created through him and for him. <sup>17</sup>He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together. <sup>18</sup>He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. <sup>19</sup>For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, <sup>20</sup>and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

Now there was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews. <sup>2</sup> This man came to Jesus<sup>[a]</sup> by night and said to him, “Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher come from God, for no one can do these signs that you do unless God is with him.” <sup>3</sup> Jesus answered him, “Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God.” <sup>4</sup> Nicodemus said to him, “How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born?” <sup>5</sup> Jesus answered, “Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. <sup>6</sup> That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. <sup>7</sup> Do not marvel that I said to you, ‘You must be born again.’ <sup>8</sup> The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear its sound, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.” <sup>9</sup> Nicodemus said to him, “How can these things be?” <sup>10</sup> Jesus answered him, “Are you the teacher of Israel and yet you do not understand these things? <sup>11</sup> Truly, truly, I say to you, we speak of what we know, and bear witness to what we have seen, but you do not receive our testimony. <sup>12</sup> If I have told you earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you heavenly things? <sup>13</sup> No one has ascended into heaven except he who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. <sup>14</sup> And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, <sup>15</sup> that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. <sup>16</sup> “For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. <sup>17</sup> For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.

### **“WE ALL BELIEVE IN ONE TRUE GOD”**

Martin Luther wrote this hymn to for us to reflect upon the glorious truth and grace of the Apostles’ Creed. Here are the 3 verses found on LBW 374.

*1 We all believe in one true God, Who created earth and heaven,  
The Father, who to us in love Has the right of children given.  
He in soul and body feeds us; All we need His hand provides us;  
Through all snares and perils leads us, Watching that no harm betide us.  
He cares for us by day and night; All things are governed by His might.*

*2 We all believe in Jesus Christ, His own Son, our Lord, possessing  
An equal Godhead, throne, and might, Source of ev’ry grace and blessing;  
Born of Mary, virgin mother, By the power of the Spirit,  
Word made flesh, our elder brother; That the lost might life inherit,  
Was crucified for all our sin And raised by God to life again.*

*3 We all confess the Holy Ghost, Who, in highest heaven dwelling  
With God the Father and the Son, Comforts us beyond all telling;  
Who the Church, His own creation, Keeps in unity of spirit.  
Here forgiveness and salvation Daily come through Jesus’ merit.  
All flesh shall rise, and we shall be In bliss with God eternally.*

*The following is from Devotions based on the Hymns of Martin Luther by Rev. Scott Schilbe:*  
“See what kind of love the Father has given to us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are” (1 John 3:1). When you ponder God the Father, you likely think of the Father’s providence, of how He provides what you need to support your body and life. You think of material blessings, gifts Luther described in his explanation of the Creed’s First Article. But why does God provide for you? God provides for all your needs because you are His child. The child/Father relationship is God the Father’s gift to you. “The Father, who to us in love Has the right of children given” (st. 1). Born “not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man,” you are born “of God” (John 1:13), born of water and the Spirit (John 3:5). You are a child of the one true God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The status of God’s child means more than God providing for you, even more than Him leading you through all “snares and perils” (st.1). The status of God’s child means that God, to save you from eternal death and hell, became your brother! For you, “born of Mary, virgin mother” (st. 2), your elder—eternal—brother was “crucified for all our sin And raised by God to life again” (st. 2). Moreover, the status of God’s child means that God constantly provides not just for your bodily needs but also for your spiritual needs. He provides this ongoing spiritual care because you—His child—continue to sin. That ongoing care results in God providing constant forgiveness in the Christian Church. “Here [in the Christian Church] forgiveness and salvation Daily come through Jesus’ merit” (st. 3). Your one true God has indeed shown His love. He created you. He provides for you. He saves you from sin. He blesses you with abundant forgiveness. He gives you these gifts because, out of love, He made you His child. Consequently, you now are free to love and serve your neighbor as a grateful response to God’s creation, redemption, and sanctification.
