*** BRIEF ORDER OF CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS**

The sign of the cross may be made by all in remembrance of their Baptism.

P: In the name of the Father, and of the + Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

P: God of all mercy and consolation, come to the aid of your people, turning us from our sin to live for you alone. Give us the power of your Holy Spirit that, attentive to your Word, we may confess our sins, receive your forgiveness, and grow into the fullness of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

C: Amen.

P: Trusting in God's steadfast love, grace and forgiveness in Christ, let us confess our sin.

Silence is kept for reflection and confession of our sins before God and one another.

P: Merciful Father,

C: we have sinned against You and one another. We do not fully live as Your beloved daughters and sons. We use Your gifts to our own ends and neglect your call to bear fruit in Your world. FIRST READING: I Kings 8:22-30

²² Then Solomon stood before the altar of the LORD in the presence of all the assembly of Israel, and spread out his hands to heaven. ²³ He said, “O LORD, God of Israel, there is no God like you in heaven above or on earth beneath, keeping covenant and steadfast love for your servants who walk before you with all their heart, ²⁴ the covenant that you kept for your servant my father David as you declared to him; you promised with your mouth and

have this day fulfilled with your hand.²⁵ Therefore, O LORD, God of Israel, keep for your servant my father David that which you promised him, saying, 'There shall never fail you a successor before me to sit on the throne of Israel, if only your children look to their way, to walk before me as you have walked before me.'²⁶ Therefore, O God of Israel, let your word be confirmed, which you promised to your servant my father David.²⁷ "But will God indeed dwell on the earth? Even heaven and the highest heaven cannot contain you, much less this house that I have built!²⁸ Regard your servant's prayer and his plea, O LORD my God, heeding the cry and the prayer that your servant prays to you today;²⁹ that your eyes may be open night and day toward this house, the place of which you said, 'My name shall be there,' that you may heed the prayer that your servant prays toward this place.³⁰ Hear the plea of your servant and of your people Israel when they pray toward this place; O hear in heaven your dwelling place; heed and forgive.

SECOND READING: I Timothy 2:1-8


¹I urge you, first of all, to pray for all people. Ask God to help them; intercede on their behalf, and give thanks for them. ²Pray this way for kings and all who are in authority so that we can live peaceful and quiet lives marked by godliness and dignity. ³This is good and pleases God our Savior, ⁴who wants everyone to be saved and to understand the truth. ⁵For there is only one God and one

Mediator who can reconcile God and humanity—the man Christ Jesus.⁶ He gave his life to purchase freedom for everyone. This is the message God gave to the world at just the right time.⁷ And I have been chosen as a preacher and apostle to teach the Gentiles this message about faith and truth. I'm not exaggerating—just telling the truth.⁸ In every place of worship, I want men to pray with holy hands lifted up to God, free from anger and controversy.

***GOSPEL: Luke 11:1-13**

P: The holy gospel according to St. Luke. C: **Glory to you, O Lord.**

He (Jesus) was praying in a certain place, and after he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples."² He said to them, "When you pray, say: Father, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come.³ Give us each day our daily bread.⁴ And forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone indebted to us. And do not bring us to the time of trial."⁵

⁵ And he said to them, "Suppose one of you has a friend, and you go to him at midnight and say to him, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread;⁶ for a friend of mine has arrived, and I have nothing to set before him.'⁷ And he answers from within, 'Do not bother me; the door has already been locked, and my children are with me in bed; I cannot get up and give you anything.'⁸ I tell you, even though he will not get up and give him anything because he is his friend, at least because of his persistence he will get up and give him whatever he needs.

⁹ So I say to you, Ask, and it will be given you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you.¹⁰ For everyone who asks receives, and everyone who searches finds, and for everyone who knocks, the door will be opened.¹¹ Is there anyone among you who, if your child asks for a fish, will give a snake instead of a fish?¹² Or if the child asks for an egg, will give a scorpion?¹³ If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy

Spirit to those who ask him!"

Luther's Small Catechism Sermon Series Part 3, The Lord's Prayer

***AFFIRMATION OF OUR BAPTISM INTO CHRIST**

P. Brothers and sisters in Christ, it is appropriate on this Lord's Day that we renew the vows once spoken at our baptisms -- that time when we were washed of our sins and received the Holy Spirit to dwell within us. Let us boldly make our confession of faith before God, renouncing the sinful life of godlessness and embracing the godly life of the Spirit-filled Christian.

I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church.

Do you renounce all the devil and all the forces defy God?

C. I renounce them.

P. Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God?

C. I renounce them.

Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God?

C. I renounce them.

P. Do you believe in God the Father?

C. I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

P. Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

C. I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

P. Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

C. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

P. You have made public profession of your faith. Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism: to live among God's faithful people, to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

C. I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

P. People of God, do you promise to support and pray for one another in your life in Christ?

C. We do, and we ask God to help and guide us.

P. Let us pray. We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give us new birth, cleanse us from sin, and raise us to eternal life. Stir up in your people the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever.

Listening for the Promise

WEEKLY DEVOTIONAL

“¹ Now Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he finished, one of his disciples said to him, ‘Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples.’ ² And he said to them, ‘When you pray, say: “Father, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come. ³ Give us each day our daily bread, ⁴ and forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone who is indebted to us. And lead us not into temptation.”’

- Luke 11:1-4 -

If we translate Luke's version of the Lord's Prayer into kingdom language, we see that all our prayer should be kingdom focused in every area of our lives. This kingdom focus helps us to make sense of Jesus' further instructions on prayer in verses 5-13.

Father	The Father is the King.
Hallowed be your name.	Hallowed be the name of the King.
Your kingdom come.	Let the King's rule come.
Give us each day our daily bread	Feed us that we may advance your Kingdom.
And forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone who is indebted to us.	Forgive our transgressions against your Kingdom law as we forgive transgressions against us.
And lead us not into temptation.	Keep us from transgressing your Kingdom law and from denying the gospel of your Kingdom.

Since we were created to serve God, our well-being consists in serving His kingdom. Hence, God gives us those good things that help us serve His kingdom, especially the Holy Spirit. Such things are good for God's kingdom and are therefore good for us as we align with His kingdom.

Note that the Lord's Prayer includes both law and gospel. We ask God to uphold His kingdom law for His own name's sake. We ask God for the strength to uphold His kingdom law and avoid temptations to break it. But we also ask God to forgive our violations of His kingdom law as we forgive others. And we do so on the basis of Christ's death and resurrection. This is pure gospel.

Jesus gave His disciples the Lord's Prayer because they asked Him how to pray. In grace and mercy, He condescended to give them (and us) a pattern for prayer so that we might commune with God, advance His kingdom, and receive forgiveness for our sins.

Finally, notice the Trinitarian pattern here. The Lord's Prayer is directed to the Father. It is given and modeled (and thus mediated) by the Son. And it is prayed in the power of the Holy Spirit.
