FIRST READING PSALM 145: 1-14, 21 (A Song of Praise. Of David)

I will extol you, my God and King, and bless your name forever and ever.² Every day I will bless you and praise your name forever and ever.³ Great is the Lord, and greatly to be praised, and his greatness is unsearchable.⁴ One generation shall commend your works to another, and shall declare your mighty acts.⁵ On the glorious splendor of your majesty, and on your wondrous works, I will meditate.⁶ They shall speak of the might of your awesome deeds, and I will declare your greatness.⁷ They shall pour forth the fame of your abundant goodness and shall sing aloud of your righteousness.


SECOND READING: Philippians 2: 1-11

So if there is any encouragement in Christ, any comfort from love, any participation in the Spirit, any affection and sympathy, ² complete my joy by being of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. ³ Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. ⁴ Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. ⁵ Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, ^[a] ⁶ who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, ^[b] ⁷ but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, ^[c] being born in the likeness of men. ⁸ And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. ⁹ Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹ and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.



²⁷There followed {Jesus} a great multitude of the people and of women who were mourning and lamenting for him. ²⁸But turning to them Jesus said, “Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me, but weep for yourselves and for your children. ²⁹For behold, the days are coming when they will say, ‘Blessed are the barren and the wombs that never bore and the

breasts that never nursed!' ³⁰Then they will begin to say to the mountains, 'Fall on us,' and to the hills, 'Cover us.' ³¹For if they do these things when the wood is green, what will happen when it is dry?" ³²Two others, who were criminals, were led away to be put to death with him. ³³And when they came to the place that is called The Skull, there they crucified him, and the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. ³⁴And Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." And they cast lots to divide his garments. ³⁵And the people stood by, watching, but the rulers scoffed at him, saying, "He saved others; let him save himself, if he is the Christ of God, his Chosen One!" ³⁶The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine ³⁷and saying, "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!" ³⁸There was also an inscription over him, "This is the King of the Jews." ³⁹One of the criminals who were hanged railed at him, saying, "Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us!" ⁴⁰But the other rebuked him, saying, "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? ⁴¹And we indeed justly, for we are receiving the due reward of our deeds; but this man has done nothing wrong." ⁴²And he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." ⁴³And he said to him, "Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in paradise."



SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

There will be a special congregational meeting immediately following worship on Sunday, December 14th. The purpose of the meeting is to vote on a proposed amendment to the Constitution which was approved by the Board at the regular November meeting on November 17th. A motion was made and seconded to amend the bylaws of the Constitution such that the following portion of section B12.02 line 2 be stricken:

“Immediate family members (family of origin = parent/child; husband/wife; siblings/blood or step; grandparents/grandchildren) shall not serve on the Board at the same time.”

Listening for the Promise

WEEKLY DEVOTIONAL

Christ the King Sunday (Proper 29) – November 23, 2025

“There was also an inscription over him, ‘This is the King of the Jews.’”

– Luke 23:38 –

The world thinks it is ridiculous that our lives are wrapped up in the story of Jesus Christ. After all, He died a spectacularly horrible death. How could He possibly give us what we need for a full and happy life? How can He be our refuge? The story of Jesus is terrible, sad, even disturbing and yet we look to the cross and find peace.

Why is this cross so important? Why would we choose to remember this moment of Christ’s life – His death on this day which is set aside for Christ the King? The sign placed above Jesus’ head on the cross called Him “The King of the Jews.” It was meant as an insult. How could a king die nearly naked hanging by a few nails on a cross? He is King because He died.

We celebrate a different kind of king. Jesus Christ did not have a typical coronation. The kings and queens of the world celebrate their elevation to monarch with grand parties and ostentatious ceremonies. It is such an important moment that they want everything to be new, beautiful, and perfect.

Jesus’ coronation was much different. On Palm Sunday, Jesus was welcomed into Jerusalem like a king. He rode a donkey, surrounded by crowds singing praise to God for the Messiah. Just a few days later, He was nailed to the cross, because He disappointed everyone who had put their hope in Him. The followers turned because He was not doing what they expected of a king. Even His closest friends betrayed, denied, and abandoned Him. Yet, it was at the very moment that Jesus cried out and gave up His spirit that He was crowned King. On that coronation cross, He fulfilled the purpose of His life, taking the entire burden of God’s justice on His flesh for our sake. His obedience to God’s will won Him the greatest crown of all and eternal life in His Kingdom for all who believe.
