P: In this season of intentional waiting and watching for the return of Christ, we are gathered together to worship in the name of the Father, Son, + Holy Spirit.

P: A voice cries in the wilderness, “Prepare the way of the Lord. Make straight in the desert a pathway for our God.” Let us come humbly before our Lord, asking for forgiveness and mercy for our sins, known and unknown, trusting in God’s promise of reconciliation and new life in Christ. P: Our Father who loves us with an everlasting love promised of old that he would send us a sign saying, “Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel.” God is with us in Christ our Lord, the word made flesh, hears our

confession and grants us undeserved mercy; be confident in his forgiveness, in the name of the Father , and of the Son + of the Holy Spirit. (Isaiah 7:14)

LITURGY FOR LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT WREATH

L: Today is the first Sunday of Advent. Advent means “coming” and in this season we prepare for the coming of Christ. One of the ways we prepare for his coming is by making an Advent wreath and lighting its candles to remind us of the gifts Christ brings to the world. The Advent wreath includes many symbols to help us think about Christ and his gifts. The wreath itself is in the shape of a circle. A circle has no beginning and no end. This reminds us that there is no beginning and no end to God and that God's love and caring are forever. The light from the candles - which grows stronger each Sunday in Advent, reminds us that Jesus is the light of the world. The candles remind us of God's gifts in Christ: Hope, Peace, Joy, Love, and Presence. Today we light the candle of hope.


L: The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light;

C: those who lived in a land of deep darkness on them light has shined.

L: We join with sisters and brothers around the world, lighting candles to mark our steps in this Advent journey.

C: Today, we light the candle of Hope and give thanks for God's gift of hope.

We light the Candle of Hope as we sing “A Candle is Burning” by Sandra Dean
(Tune: Away in a Manger)



**A Candle is burning, a flame warm and bright,
a candle of hope in December's dark night.
While angels sing blessing from heaven's starry sky,
our hearts we prepare now for Jesus is nigh.**

L: Even though the world seems dark and cold, we know that the light of Christ is shining in the darkness and the darkness cannot overcome it. The face of our Lord shines upon us and we are saved!

C: Hope is like a light shining in a dark place. We celebrate the hope we have in Jesus Christ and our calling to share this hope with the world by letting our light shine before others.

L: Let us “always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have.” (1 Peter 3:14)

C: We continue to hope in God's promise that Christ will come again to fill our lives and the lift of the world with love and joy and peace.

L: Let us pray: Stir up your power, O Lord and come, that by your protection we may be rescued from the threatening perils of our sins and saved by your mighty deliverance. We thank you God for the hope you give us. We ask that as we wait for the fulfillment of Your promises and for Christ to come again, that you would remain present with us. Help us today, and every day to worship you, to hear your word, and to do your will by sharing your hope with each other. We ask it in the name of the one who was born in Bethlehem, Jesus Christ our Lord who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **C: Amen.**

FIRST READING Isaiah 2: 1-5

¹The word that Isaiah the son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem. ²It shall come to pass in the latter days that the mountain of the house of the LORD shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be lifted up above the hills; and all the nations shall flow to it, ³and many peoples shall come, and say: “Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the house of the God of Jacob, that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths.” For out of Zion shall go forth the law, and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem. ⁴He shall judge between the nations, and shall decide disputes for many peoples; and they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war anymore. ⁵O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the LORD.

SECOND READING: Romans 15: 1-13

We who are strong have an obligation to bear with the failings of the weak, and not to please ourselves.² Let each of us please his neighbor for his good, to build him up.³ For Christ did not please himself, but as it is written, “The reproaches of those who reproached you fell on me.”⁴ For whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, that through endurance and through the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope.⁵ May the God of endurance and encouragement grant you to live in such harmony with one another, in accord with Christ Jesus,⁶ that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.⁷ Therefore welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God.⁸ For I tell you that Christ became a servant to the circumcised to show God's truthfulness, in order to confirm the promises given to the patriarchs,⁹ and in order that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy. As it is written, “Therefore I will praise you among the Gentiles, and sing to your name.”¹⁰ And again it says, “Rejoice, O Gentiles, with his people.”¹¹ And again, “Praise the Lord, all you Gentiles, and let all the peoples extol him.”¹² And again Isaiah says, “The root of Jesse will come, even he who arises to rule the Gentiles; in him will the Gentiles hope.”¹³ May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope.

Listening for the Promise

WEEKLY DEVOTIONAL

First Sunday in Advent – November 30, 2025

“³⁶[Jesus said,] ‘But concerning that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but the Father only. ³⁷For as were the days of Noah, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. ³⁸For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day when Noah entered the ark, ³⁹and they were unaware until the flood came and swept them all away, so will be the coming of the Son of Man.’”

- Matthew 24:36-39 -

One thing I don't like is to feel caught off-guard. I like to feel well-prepared, especially if something big is about to happen. But that isn't always how life presents itself. God warned Noah that he would bring a flood down on the earth, and God told Noah how to be well prepared for said event. Back in September 2019, I was serving a two-point rural parish in Southeast South Dakota. Earlier in the week, Sioux Falls had experienced four tornadoes in one night. Later that week, we were planning to celebrate Homecoming in our town. But the weather report turned everyone's plans upside down.

One of the dams had broken up North of where we were located. We'd had lots of rain waters, and we were receiving word that the Jim River, which runs close to the small country church I served, would soon be filled with raging water, and we should expect the worst for flooding. Our time was limited, but people in the community came together to sandbag and help put up a levy to keep the flood waters from damaging the little stone church. We didn't have a lot of time to prepare, but we had just enough. The waters came, but the church was safe. The news of flood waters coming our way, however, caught us off-guard. We had to drop whatever it was we were doing and heed the warnings of others.

Jesus tells us that we will not know the day or the hour of when he will return to us. No one knows. Not the angels. Not even Jesus himself, the Son of God. However, God has given us plenty of time to prepare for that unexpected moment when Jesus will come back again. God has given us his gifts of grace, forgiveness of sin, and eternal life through the sacraments of Baptism and Holy Communion. We wait for Jesus' imminent return, and as we do so, we witness the pain and heartache around us. We bear witness to conflict, violence, disease, and death. But we also bear witness to the promise that God is always with us. He comes to us through the waters of baptism and the bread and wine of Holy Communion. Thanks be to God! Come, Lord Jesus!
