P: In this season of intentional waiting and watching for the return of Christ, we are gathered together to worship in the name of the Father, Son, + Holy Spirit.



LITANY FOR LIGHTING THE ADVENT CANDLES: THE CANDLE OF PEACE

L: Last Sunday we lit the first candle in our Advent Wreath, the candle of hope. It has been lit again as we remember that Christ, who was born in Bethlehem is our hope. Our hope is that Christ will come again and fulfill all of God's promises. The second candle of Advent is the Candle of Peace. Through the cross, Christ reconciled us to God and brought peace with God which enables us to be reconciled or at peace with one another. When Christ comes again He will bring everlasting peace. The prophet Isaiah called Christ "the Prince of *Peace*". "And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of *Peace*." (Isaiah 9)



C: “Of the increase of his government and *peace* there will be no end. He will reign on David’s throne and over his kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and forever.”

L: When Jesus was born the angels proclaimed the good news as they sang about God's gift of peace to the earth.

C: “Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth *peace* to those on whom his favor rests.” (Luke 2:14)

L: When Jesus came he taught people the importance of being peace makers and called for them to live as peacemakers.

C: He said, “Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.” (Matthew 5:9)

L: Our Lord Jesus is our peace and has broken down the dividing wall between God and people. He bore our sins as he was crucified on the cross to bring reconciliation and *peace* to us all.

C: But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us *peace* was on him, and by his wounds we are healed. (Isaiah 53:5)

L: On the third day, Jesus rose from the dead to bring victory over sin and death and to bring *peace* to all. Jesus appeared to the disciples and showed them his hand and side and said to them, C: **“*Peace* be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you.”**²² **And with that he breathed on them and said, “Receive the Holy Spirit.”** (John 20)

We sing “A Candle is Burning” (tune: Away in a Manger) as we light the Candle of Peace

A Candle is burning, a candle of peace, a candle to signal that conflict must cease: for Jesus is coming to show us the way; a message of peace humbly laid in the hay.

L: Let us pray... O God of Peace, we thank you for Your gift of Peace in Jesus Christ our Lord who lived, died, and rose again so that we might have peace with You and one another. Fill us with your Holy Spirit that we may be instruments of your peace. Help us to live in peace with one another and seek to be peacemakers in this broken and darkened world by shining the light of Christ's love into all the world. As we live as peacemakers may the world see in us our glorious Prince of Peace, Jesus Christ our Lord, in whose name we pray. **Amen**

FIRST READING **Isaiah 11: 1-10**

A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots. ²The spirit of the LORD shall rest on him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD. ³His delight shall be in the fear of the LORD. He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide by what his ears hear; ⁴but with righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth; he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked. ⁵Righteousness shall be the belt around his waist, and faithfulness the belt around his loins. ⁶The wolf shall live with the lamb, the leopard shall lie down with the kid, the calf and the lion and the fatling together, and a little child shall lead them. ⁷The cow and the bear shall graze, their young shall lie down together; and the lion shall eat straw like the ox. ⁸The nursing child shall play over the hole of the asp, and the weaned child shall put its hand on the adder's den. ⁹They will not hurt or destroy on all my holy mountain; for the earth will be full of the knowledge of the LORD as the waters cover the sea. ¹⁰On that day the root of Jesse shall stand as a signal to the peoples; the nations shall inquire of him, and his dwelling shall be glorious.

²You have forgiven the iniquity of your people and blotted out all their sins.

⁸I will listen to what the LORD God is saying; for you speak peace to your faithful people and to those who turn their hearts to you.

⁹Truly, your salvation is very near to those who fear you, that your glory may dwell in our land.

¹⁰Steadfast love and faithfulness have met together; righteousness and peace have kissed each other.

¹¹Faithfulness shall spring up from the earth, and righteousness shall look down from heaven.

¹²The LORD will indeed grant prosperity, and our land will yield its increase.

¹³Righteousness shall go before the LORD and shall prepare for God a pathway.

SECOND READING: Ephesians 2: 14-22

¹⁴For he is our peace; in his flesh he has made both groups into one and has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us. ¹⁵He has abolished the law with its commandments and ordinances, that he might create in himself one new humanity in place of the two, thus making peace, ¹⁶and might reconcile both groups to God in one body through the cross, thus putting to death that hostility through it. ¹⁷So he came and proclaimed peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near; ¹⁸for through him both of us have access in one Spirit to the Father. ¹⁹So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God, ²⁰built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the cornerstone. ²¹In him the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord; ²²in whom you also are built together spiritually into a dwelling place for God.

¹In those days John the Baptist came preaching in the wilderness of Judea, ²“Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.” ³For this is he who was spoken of by the prophet Isaiah when he said, “The voice of one crying in the wilderness: ‘Prepare the way of the Lord; make his paths straight.’” ⁴Now John wore a garment of camel’s hair and a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. ⁵Then Jerusalem and all Judea and all the region about the Jordan were going out to him, ⁶and they were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. ⁷But when he saw many of the Pharisees and



Every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. ¹¹I baptize you with water for repentance, but he who is coming after me is mightier than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. ¹²His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor and gather his wheat into the barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.”



Listening for the Promise

WEEKLY DEVOTIONAL

Second Sunday in Advent – December 7, 2025

“There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch from his roots shall bear fruit. ²And the Spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord.”

- Isaiah 11:1-2 -

The botanical life of most trees is amazing. Often when a tree is damaged and the trunk is cut down, a new shoot will come up out of the stump or roots. So long as the roots are healthy, it will try to live. It will put out new shoots and eventually try to flower and reproduce. It keeps adapting to its circumstances and tries its best to thrive.

One of my favorite activities is to be out in nature, especially walking or hiking through a forest. Ever since I was a young girl, I spent a lot of time in Fontenelle Forest of Bellevue, Nebraska, where I grew up. I hiked with my parents and grandparents. My husband and I had our engagement photos taken in Fontenelle Forest. And now, when I go back to visit, I take my kids to the forest. I had a very special relationship with my maternal grandfather. I loved holding his hand as we walked the trails, and later on, we walked the boardwalk through the forest as his body didn't allow him to walk on the uneven trails anymore. My grandpa knew a lot about nature and God's creation.

One time we were walking along, and I noticed how several trees had been cut down. My grandpa said it could be that they were diseased, or they were at risk of falling over on the boardwalk. I mentioned it was a little sad to see them cut down, but then I saw something. It was bright green, and it appeared to be growing out of the crack in the middle of the stump. Grandpa said it was a new shoot. The roots were continuing to produce, and out of what appeared to be dead, well, there was new life. Grandpa said it would eventually grow into its own tree.

I think of that moment every time I revisit these words from Isaiah 11. Jesse, his son David, and David's son Solomon were gone. What appeared to be left of that family tree was nothing but a dead stump. But wait! Isaiah says God will grow a brand-new shoot out of that stump. It will produce a Branch. And the Branch will produce fruit. This Branch would eventually be known to us as the Messiah, Jesus Christ. The lineage of David would continue on as God would give us a brand-new David in Jesus Christ. In Him there is life and salvation, and we know that death no longer has its grip on us.
