*** BRIEF ORDER OF CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS**

The sign of the cross may be made by all in remembrance of their Baptism.

P: In this season of intentional waiting and watching for the return of Christ, we are gathered together to worship in the name of the Father, Son, + Holy Spirit.

C: Amen

P: A voice cries in the wilderness, "Prepare the way of the Lord. Make straight in the desert a pathway for our God." Let us come humbly before our Lord, asking for forgiveness and mercy for our sins, known and unknown, trusting in God's promise of reconciliation and new life in Christ. (Isaiah 40:3)

(Silence for self-reflection and examination)

P: God of grace,

C: We confess that we have not been attentive to the call to prepare for the coming of your Son. We have focused our vision on things of the moment and neglected to wait and watch for his return. P: Our Father who loves us with an everlasting love promised of old that he would send us a sign saying, "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel." God is with us in Christ our Lord, the word made flesh, and hears our

confession and grants us undeserved mercy; be confident in his forgiveness, in the name of the Father , and of the Son + of the Holy Spirit. (Isaiah 7:14)

LITANY FOR LIGHTING THE ADVENT CANDLES: THE CANDLE OF JOY

L: We have lit two candles which remind us of God’s gifts of hope and peace that come to us in our Savior, Christ Jesus. Our hope in Christ is like an anchor to our souls, firm and strong in the midst of storms. In Christ we have peace with God and one another. The third candle of Advent is the Candle of Joy. When the angel Gabriel told Mary that she would give birth the long-awaited Messiah, she was filled with joy.

C: She sang a song of joy: "My soul magnifies the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my Savior." (Luke 1)

L: When Jesus was born, the angels announced the good news of great joy to the shepherds:

C: “Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. (Luke 2)

L: Jesus said that “the kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field.”

C: “When a man found it, he hid it again, and then in his joy went and sold all he had and bought that field.” (Matthew 13)

L: Jesus came “to proclaim the year of the LORD’s favor, to comfort all who mourn, and provide for those who grieve in Zion—

C: to bestow on them a crown of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of joy instead of mourning, and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair.” (Isaiah 61)

L: Jesus said, “If you keep my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father’s commands and remain in his love.”

C: “I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete. ¹² My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you.” (John 15)

L: As we continue our journey in the Advent Season, we ask God to restore our joy.

C: Do not cast me from your presence or take your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation and grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me. (Psalm 51)

We Light the Advent Candle of Joy as we sing “*A Candle is Burning*” to the tune of “*Away in a Manger*”

*A candle is burning, a candle of joy.
A candle to welcome brave Mary's new boy.
Our hearts fill with wonder, and eyes light and glow
As joy brightens winter like sunshine on snow.*

L: Let us pray. God of hope, peace and joy, we thank you for the gift of joy that comes to us in Christ who has restored unto us the joy of our salvation. Prepare our hearts to be transformed by You, that we may walk in the light of Christ and joyfully shine the light of Christ’s love. As we continue our Advent journey, help us, like Mary, to joyfully worship You, to hear Your Word and to do your will so that our joy may be complete in Christ, for it is in Jesus’ name that we pray. **C: Amen**

FIRST READING Zephaniah 3: 14-20

¹⁴“Sing aloud, O daughter of Zion; shout, O Israel! Rejoice and exult with all your heart, O daughter of Jerusalem! ¹⁵The Lord has taken away the judgments against you; he has cleared away your enemies. The King of Israel, the Lord, is in your midst; you shall never again fear evil. ¹⁶On that day it shall be said to Jerusalem: Fear not, O Zion; let not your hands grow weak. ¹⁷The Lord your God is in your midst, a mighty one who will save; he will rejoice over you with gladness; he will quiet you by his love; he will exult over you with loud singing. ¹⁸I will gather those of you who mourn for the festival, so that you will no longer suffer reproach. ¹⁹Behold, at that time I will deal with all your oppressors. And I will save the lame and gather the outcast, and I will change their shame into praise and renown in all the earth. ²⁰At that time I will bring you in, at the time when I gather you together; for I will make you renowned and praised among all the peoples of the earth, when I restore your fortunes before your eyes,” says the Lord.

P: The holy gospel according to St. Luke. C: **Glory to you, O Lord.**

²⁶In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, ²⁷to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. And the virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸And he came to her and said, “Greetings, O favored one, the Lord is with you!” ²⁹But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and tried to discern what sort of greeting this might be. ³⁰And the angel said to her, “Do not be afraid, Mary, for you

have found favor with God. ³¹ And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. ³² He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. And the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, ³³ and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end.” ³⁴ And Mary said to the angel, “How will this be, since I am a virgin?” ³⁵ And the angel answered her, “The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be called holy—the Son of God. ³⁶ And behold, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son, and this is the sixth month with her who was called barren. ³⁷ For nothing will be impossible with God.” ³⁸ And Mary said, “Behold, I am the servant of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word.” And the angel departed from her. ³⁹ In those days Mary arose and went with haste into the hill country, to a town in Judah, ⁴⁰ and she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. ⁴¹ And when Elizabeth heard the greeting of Mary, the baby leaped in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit, ⁴² and she exclaimed with a loud cry, “Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb! ⁴³ And why is this granted to me that the mother of my Lord should come to me? ⁴⁴ For behold, when the sound of your greeting came to my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy. ⁴⁵ And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her from the Lord.”

Just Like Mary

God chose Mary to bear the baby Jesus in her womb and in her arms, but Mary's story is not about a woman of sinless perfection. She didn't need to be. She was chosen by God to bring the good news of salvation into the world.

Her life was not pain free. She was just a child when she became pregnant. She was mistreated as a whore. She gave birth in a cold stable, and then went on the run with her husband and young child to save his life. When Joseph died, her position as a widow in society was quite low. She deeply loved her son, but at times he seemed to disregard and disrespect her. Think about the stories: the day they could not find him because he went to the temple, the wedding at Cana where He told her that it wasn't time, the time she and Jesus' brothers went to talk to Him and He told her that those listening were His mother and brothers. And then, after all this, Mary watched her son die a horrible death: execution on the cross.

Mary deserves to be remembered not because she is greater than you and me, but because she is just like us. Her story as a sinner and saint is just like ours. There were times when she was an obstacle to His ministry, but she remained humble and faithful to the God she loved. We are just like Mary, blocking Jesus' work in this world, and yet God is able to use us to bear the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the world.

Mary knew that Jesus offered a life-changing gift, the gift of forgiveness and eternal life. True faith comes to those with a humble heart. It comes to those who recognize their need for mercy and grace which Jesus won for us in His life, death, and resurrection. Despite her moments of failure, Mary knew Jesus came to do God's will and she humbly accepted His call on her life. Jesus calls us to share the good news of His salvation with the world, just like Mary.
